Discussed membership – 42 new members per month needed. Density good, recruitment could be significant in schools and CVS.

4. FINANCIAL REPORT

- (a) Branch finances are healthy. OLBA will eventually allow more detailed reports to be given.
- (b) Industrial Action Fund Proposal Branch Secretary explained how funding is calculated for branch, what funds we have, that the Industrial Action fund is substantial and ring-fenced. Could some of this money be used for other branch activities? A floor discussion took place and any changes would have to be agreed at a Special Branch Committee **AGREED in principle.**

5. PAY CONSULTATION UPDATE

PG informed 19% responded to consultative vote – majority favoured Option 2 (£1 per hour increase) – results forwarded to Regional Office. May need to include extra option in future for votes where neither recommendation is acceptable.

6. BUDGET 2014/15

End of Year 1, beginning of Year 2 – Integrated Services Review in CCS, Leisure & Libraries – 50 jobs to go. On-going issues with matrix.

Cooperative Council – Continue to challenge 3 year budget cuts plan – lobby locally, regionally and nationally. PG + TC to visit Directors and Asst. Directors to discuss experience of working within Year 1 – project to be completed quickly need feedback with evidence. Floor discussed excessive

flexi, sickness, working time directive etc. Campaign actively to encourage members to complete Stress Survey – to be done in November, will bring results to branch committee.

Care Cooperative – Branch has asked Council lead for meeting with shop stewards to have an opportunity to discuss and inform, will arrange special Branch Committee as soon as date is known – facility time to be approved, Retired Members to be involved. Questions asked about TUPE, privatisation, social enterprise, ALMOs etc. Literature available from the branch office.

7. TEACHER'S INDUSTRIAL ACTION IN SCHOOLS

NUT & NASUWT Industrial Action -17^{th} October. Council has given advice to schools; UNISON has written to all Head Teachers and advice in Outlines is included. Contact branch office if unsure - still awaiting list of school closures.

8. <u>LGPS 2014</u>

Update given from PG, changes in place from 01.04.14. Post Xmas arrange series of briefings in workplace. Capital Stewardship Programme explained – to get control of pension scheme – enabling ethical investment. Meeting was held in London, now working on briefings. Need more pension's champions, training will be given – contact branch if interested. Working with NCC to encourage more people to join the scheme – cannot rely on state pension only.
